The board meeting for Sylvan Township was called to order by Supervisor Angie Moore at 6:01 p.m. on November 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022 at the Sylvan Township Hall.

Minutes for the October 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2022 regular board meeting were read by Terry Pritchard. Angie Reagan made a motion to accept the minutes as read, seconded by Jeff Reagan. Motion carried.

In old business:

- ✓ The quote for fixing the bridge on 11 Mile road came in from the county at a cost of \$19,000. The repair is a 50/50 share between the township and county. The township cost is \$9,500. Jeff Reagan made a motion to accept the bid, Angie Reagan seconded. Motion carried.
- ✓ The township also received the gravel map. Angie Moore will forward some revisions to the road commission.

In new business:

- ✓ Terry Pritchard informed the board that the roof on the storage shed at the cemetery is leaking. A quote for materials was obtained from Marion lumber in the amount of \$854.20 for materials. Angie Reagan made a motion to purchase the materials and pay Brent Pritchard and Floyd Ankney to replace the roof, Sheila Robinson seconded. Motion carried.

In public comments:

- ✓ Tim Michell informed the board that the county approved the budget next year. The fund balance stands at \$7.1 million.

In Fire Department News:

- ✓ The \$100,000 check from the USDA is still coming. Shane had to turn in additional paperwork. A representative from the USDA will be meeting Angie at the bank to deposit the check.
- ✓ The board approved the purchase of pagers to replace those that had been lost or not returned when workers discontinue to be with the department. A question was raised as to whether insurance could get involved and also what can be done to assure they are returned when workers discontinue working for the department.
- ✓ The board approved the purchase of 5 air tanks and will have them filled weekly due to issues getting them back from the county.

A motion to pay bills was made by Jeff Reagan, seconded by Sheila Robinson. Motion carried. All bills were reviewed with checks #3389-3406 in the amount of \$8,408.81 were paid.

A motion to adjourn was made by Jeff Reagan, seconded by Sheila Robinson. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 6:52 p.m.
